

BEN HECHT & CHARLES MACARTHUR PLAYWRIGHTS

Ben Hecht (1894 - 1964) was born in New York. He was a screenwriter, director, producer, playwright, journalist, and novelist. Jean-Luc Godard called him "a genius" who "invented 80 percent of what is used in Hollywood movies today."



He wrote dozens of now-classic scripts, including *Scarface*. His first screenplay was *Underworld* for which he won an Academy Award for Best Original Screenplay in Hollywood's first Academy award ceremony. Soon afterward, he became the most prolific and highest paid screenwriter in Hollywood. The Dictionary of Literary Biography - American Screenwriters calls him "one of the most successful screenwriters in the history of motion pictures".

After graduating from high school in 1910, Hecht ran away to Chicago where he became a noted journalist, foreign correspondent, and literary figure. While living in Chicago, he met fellow reporter Charles MacArthur and together they moved to New York to write together.

Charles MacArthur (1895 - 1956) was born in Scranton, Pennsylvania. He was a journalist, dramatist, and screenwriter, and was married to the famous actress Helen Hayes.

Aged 19, he went to the City News Bureau of Chicago to become a journalist, going on to become one of Chicago's most well-known and widely read reporters. He wrote some of the most enduring pieces ever printed in the pages of the *Chicago Tribune* and *Daily News*.

Both Hecht and MacArthur owe their literary origins to the newspapers of Chicago. Famous crime reporters, their talents were first cradled in the recounting of great exploits in arson, rape, murder, gang war, and municipal politics.

The New York collaboration between them produced *The Front Page*. It was widely acclaimed and had a successful run on Broadway of 281 performances, beginning in August 1928. In 1931, it was turned into a successful film, which was nominated for three Oscars (for Best Picture, Best Director and Best Actor).

Hecht and MacArthur worked in Hollywood writing screenplays but it was also during this period that they produced their second smash theatrical effort, *Twentieth Century*, which debuted on Broadway in December 1932, and was later made into the well-received 1934 movie starring John Barrymore.

Unhappy with the machinations of Hollywood's film industry, MacArthur and Hecht decided to set up their own shop in Astoria, New York, producing, writing, directing, and even making uncredited onscreen appearances in a series of films such as *The Scoundrel* (1935) - poking fun at themselves by playing downtrodden patrons of a charity flop house; and *Crime Without Passion* (1934) - in which they portrayed... newspaper reporters. Their work earned much critical acclaim, culminating in the 1936 Best Writing (Original Story) Academy Award for *The Scoundrel*. Their 1939 collaboration to turn Rudyard Kipling's epic poem into the movie *Gunga Din* (1939), starring Cary Grant, was recognized in 1999 by the National Film Registry, and their adaptation of Emily Brontë's *Wuthering Heights* (1939) garnered the two yet another Academy Award Best Writing (Screenplay) nomination. In 1940, *The Front Page* was remade nto the popular movie, *His Girl Friday*, starring Rosalind Russell and Cary Grant.

Both Ben Hecht and Charles MacArthur were posthumously inducted into The American Theatre Hall of Fame.

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

As a Director (indeed, as a spectator) I have what many might call an old school perspective about what theatre ought to be: it should - regardless of its genre – be entertaining. If it has deep & meaningful social comment or insight to impart, this is a welcome by-product. So when one asks me, is this play worth doing today (given it premiered in 1928), I say it sure meets my criteria, so damn straight it is, because it's as entertaining as they come. The Front Page is essentially, an unashamedly, fast and furious comedy. However, for those seeking context and relevance, subtly woven throughout this big, wisecracking, Broadway farce, are issues that are as potent today as they were when it premiered: corruption in politics, media manipulation, sexism, racism, gender inequality as well as an insight into the world of journalists and - most specifically - the obsession with one's work when nothing else matters but one's career. If that isn't enough the story intertwines two very different love stories.

It's about us, about humanity and that is always relevant.

In staging the production, given the hyper reality of the text, I wanted a stylized setting that would also remind us of the actual world beyond the doors of the pressroom, and with Paris Burrows' amazing input, I think we've managed to accomplish this.

I hope you enjoy what I think is an absolute corker of a show. A theatrical rollercoaster that will entertain, make you laugh, and give you some cause for thought after the comedy subsides.

PARIS BURROWS PRODUCTION & COSTUME DESIGNER

Paris is a multidisciplinary designer working across fashion, screen and live performance. She is a recent graduate of NIDA's Bachelor of Fine Arts: Design for Performance course.

For New Theatre: Debut.

Other notable productions include All My Sons, Colonial Experience, The Matchgirls, Indians, First Class Women, Henry 1V Part 1, Macbeth, Cloud Nine, A Man for All Seasons, The Chapel Perilous, The Wild Duck, The Woman in the Window, The Voysey Inheritance, Angels in America, The Lovely Bones, The Spook, Chimerica, Jellyfish and The Ballad of Maria Marten.

Michael has also designed sound for 220 productions, 11 of which have been for New Theatre, including *The Front Page*.

Nick is an actor, director, and voice & dialect specialist with 20 years experience in the industry. 


BRAYDON MAY SAMUEL PINCUS

NATHAN PORTEUS MAYOR THOMPSON




REUBEN SOLOMON MIKE ENDICOTT
