SUZIE MILLER PLAYWRIGHT

Suzie Miller was born in Melbourne and now shares her time between London and Sydney.

She is a graduate of Monash University, the University of NSW and NIDA (playwriting). She worked as a human rights lawyer before moving to London, with her husband and two children, to pursue full time writing for theatre.

Her first play, *Cross Sections*, was based on contemporary stories from the experience of working as a lawyer for homeless youth in Sydney's Kings Cross. It premiered at the Old Fitz Theatre before transferring to Sydney Opera House.

She has written many plays since then but came to global attention with *Prima Facie*, which won the Griffin Award, the Australian Writers' Guild's Major AWGIE Award and the David Williamson Award for outstanding Theatre Writing and then went on to win the 2023 Laurence Olivier Award for Best New Play. The play was a huge success in the West End in London and on Broadway in New York. She has now adapted it for the screen and as a novel.

Sunset Strip was first produced by Griffin Theatre in 2017.

Suzie Miller talking about her play before its first production:-

"I especially wanted to write a play that had two strong women characters up front and centre; they are the main story of this play. I make no apologies for the very female nature of the storytelling — how women talk, relate and move through life. Indeed I fully embrace and celebrate it. But the male characters in this play are also fundamental to the telling of the story. Everyone in 'Sunset Strip' is confronting their fears.

'Human beings are remarkable at finding hope in the hardest and most unlikely places. Strangely it is this mixture of hope and horror that drew me to the world of this play. Because in being lost, ill, getting old, having cancer, melting down or screwing up — we are at our most human, and sometimes that's the place where the best laughs are."

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

As soon as I began to read the script, I wanted to breathe life into Suzie Miller's beautiful world and immerse myself and the actors in each character's life.

I love the way all of the characters show strength through vulnerability. People cope with life's traumas in different ways, and this play explores those differences without judgement. While the themes canvassed may seem 'heavy' - addiction, cancer, dementia, grief - the way they are handled is delicate and humane and often very funny. These are issues that will have touched most people's lives but we often find hard to talk about. This play creates a touchstone to start thinking about having the difficult conversations.

I'm excited to bring this play to New Theatre's stage because it's an intimate space that allows for great flexibility in staging and the team is wonderfully supportive.

Annette has freelanced as a creative for many years, co-developing and managing several of her own production companies including an animatronic display company and a children's entertainment company. Fourteen years ago she developed a business specialising in diversional therapy entertainment which she performs for residents in aged care facilities. She also works as an actor specialising in emotionally complex, immersive improvisational role play as part of an education team focusing on difficult conversations and dealing with bad news.


MOLLY HADDON PHOEBE

Violet is cuurrently studying a Bachelor of Media Arts and Production at University of Technology Sydney. For New Theatre: Debut.


She has previously participated in many theatre workshops including programs at The Australian Film Television and Radio School, The
