MARTIN MCDONAGH PLAYWRIGHT

McDonagh was born in 1970 to Irish parents in London. He spent many of his childhood summers with his family in the Connemara region on the west coast of Ireland, where his father was raised. Connemara would later serve as a setting for many of McDonagh's plays.

McDonagh left school at age 16, with plans of becoming a writer, having been inspired by his brother, who had also left school early to pursue writing. For the next few years, McDonagh wrote a series of grotesque stories, plays, and scripts. He sent some of his writing to film companies, but none of it was accepted.

After submitting the plays to numerous theatre companies, he found success with the Druid Theatre. *The Beauty Queen of Leenane*, premiered in Galway in 1996 in a coproduction by Druid and the Royal Court Theatre Company. Critics heralded its idiosyncratic dialogue, dark humour, and unsentimental view of rural Ireland. The other two plays in the Leenane Trilogy, *A Skull in Connemara* and *The Lonesome West*, premiered the following year. *The Cripple of Inishmaan* also debuted in 1996, at the National Theatre in London.

In 1998, *The Beauty Queen of Leenane* made its Broadway debut. It earned six Tony Award nominations, winning four. *The Lieutenant of Inishmore* premiered in 2001 in a production by the Royal Shakespeare Company at Stratford-upon-Avon, England. His next play, *The Pillowman*, premiered in London in 2003 at the National Theatre. Its Broadway production in 2005 was nominated for six Tony Awards, including best play.

In 2008, he wrote and directed his first feature-length film, *In Bruges*. It earned an Academy Award nomination for best original screenplay and won a BAFTA Award for best original screenplay. McDonagh's next film, *Three Billboards Outside Ebbing, Missouri*, received seven Academy Award nominations, including for best film and best original screenplay.

In 2022, McDonagh wrote and directed *The Banshees of Inisherin*. It earned nine Academy Award nominations, including for best film, directing, and original screenplay. At the BAFTAs, the film won for best British film and original screenplay; in addition, Kerry Condon and Barry Keoghan won for best supporting actress and actor, respectively.

Hangmen received its world premiere production at the Royal Court Theatre in London in 2015, and won the 2016 Olivier Award for Best New Play. It premiered on Broadway in 2022 and earned five Tony nominations, including for best play.

Martin McDonagh on Hangmen: "I hoped to keep it fresh, but still have old fashioned twists and turns – that was something that I thought could be interesting...because we don't really do plays with twists and turns anymore, it seems. Everything today feels like it has to be a lecture. So, to be able to sort of shock people with a plot twist is something that I've always enjoyed trying."

This Australian premiere of *Hangmen* is the fourth play by Martin McDonagh produced at New Theatre, following on from *The Beauty Queen of Leenane* (2003), *The Pillowman* (2013) and *The Lieutenant of Inishmore* (2018).

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

The charm of Martin McDonagh's work lies in his mastery of black comedy - an oeuvre which blends comedy and tragedy with lots of dark, dark humour. There are twists and turns that you don't see coming and lots of subtle observations on relationships and life. McDonagh's thread is always that of human despair and how the reaction to that despair drives an individual's actions. If we are honest with ourselves (and this is where our uncomfortable laughter comes from) we recognise how much what we do in life is driven by despair. And hope. Like his characters, we are all bruised by life. And these are the concepts which have driven our vision – despair and bruising.

A play like this must be a team effort and I am deeply grateful to the absolute commitment and love given by the creatives and cast to this project. Rehearsals have been places and times of laughter and camaraderie as we all embraced our inner gremlins and let them out to play.

As with all McDonagh's work, we shouldn't laugh. But it is hard not to.



DEBORAH MULHALL DIRECTOR & CO-SOUND DESIGNER

Deborah started as an actress, appearing in *Taming of the Shrew* (Little Theatre), *A Midsummer Night's Dream* (Ars Viva) and *Arms and the Man*. She moved on to directing and then writing for stage. Deborah has studied at NIDA and La MaMa International, written nine full length plays and directed over twenty. She is represented and published by Australian Plays Transform. Her play *Cry, Wolf* ran off-Broadway for eight weeks and has been, like *Gentlemen Inc*, optioned for film. *Breathless*, a war play, was a finalist in the Silver Gull Play Award 2019. Other works have been translated and performed overseas including the triptych *The Kiss*, three short plays for the LGBTQIA+ community and currently touring in Ecuador. Deborah was a founding member of the Parramatta Theatre Company, one-time President of the Illawarra Council for the Performing Arts, a life member of Workshop Theatre and has been Education Officer for New Theatre.

For New Theatre: Director, Britannia Waves the Rules, The Lieutenant of Inishmore, Pygmalion and The Lovely Bones, and costume designer on The Ballad of Maria Marten. Other directing credits include: Much Ado About Nothing (Genesian Theatre Co) and The Pond (Flight Path).



TOM BANNERMAN SET DESIGNER

Tom is a Sydney-based set-designer. His body-of-work is considerable, with *Ink* being his 291st production and his eightieth set-design for New Theatre.

His most recent New Theatre productions are Ink, The Ballad of Maria Marten, Jumpers for Goalposts, Chimerica, The Spook, Glengarry Glen Ross, Neighbourhood Watch, The Grapes of Wrath, Pygmalion, My Night with Reg, The Elements of an Offence, The Lieutenant of Inishmore, The HIV Monologues, The Little Dog Laughed, Marat/Sade, That Eye/The Sky, The Ritz, When the Rain Stops Falling, Dying for It and Jerusalem.

Tim has worked in management for a number of arts organisations including Opera Australia, and continues to lecture internationally on Arts Management and Theatre Production since 2016. For New Theatre: Debut.

Tim has been involved nationally and internationally with 750+ productions, projects and events which include opera, operetta, musical, concert, drama, pantomime, ballet, dance, cabaret, circus, commedia dell'arte, son et lumière, devised theatre, conferences and industry events. Tim is an

active composer in his spare time, and recently completed writing his first three-act ballet, and is now embarking on a new ballet for the Vietnam National Opera and Ballet.



HELEN KOHLHAGEN COSTUME DESIGNER

Helen is a Sydney-based designer with many years of experience. For New Theatre: Debut.
