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SAMUEL ADAMSON PLAYWRIGHT

Samuel Adamson is an Australian playwright and screenwriter who has lived and worked in the UK since 1991. He was born in Adelaide in 1969 and lives in London.

His plays, musicals and adaptations include: *The Ballad of Hattie and James, Wife, Running Wild* (a children's theatre piece based on the book by Michael Morpurgo), *Gabriel* (created for the trumpeter Alison Balsom), *The Light Princess* (music by Tori Amos), *Southwark Fair* (National Theatre), *Mrs Affleck* (from Ibsen's Little Eyolf, National Theatre), *Breakfast at Tiffany's* (from the Trumane Capote novella), *Frank* & Ferdinand, Fish and Company, Clocks and Whistles, Drink, Dance, Laugh and Lie, Grace Note, Some Kind of Bliss and All About My Mother (from Pedro Almodóvar's)

film).

His versions of theatre classics include: Chekhov's Uncle Vanya, The Cherry Orchard and Three Sisters, and Ibsen's Pillars of the Community and A Doll's House.

He has worked with many of the leading directors of UK theatre, as writer and dramaturg/textual advisor, including Nicholas Hytner, Marianne Elliott, Dominic Dromgoole, Sean Matthias and Thea Shorrock.

He is the recipient of the Kevin Elyot Award 2023 (supporting a writer-in-residence at the University of Bristol Theatre Collection. He was Artistic Associate on the Tony Award-winning stage adaptation of Michael Morpurgo's *War Horse* and writer-in-residence at the Bush Theatre in 1997-8. In 2019, he delivered the Annual Ibsen Lecture at the Centre for Ibsen Studies at the University of Oslo.

His adaptation of Peter Carey's Miles Franklin Award-winning novel Jack Maggs will be given its world premiere by the State Theatre Company South Australia in November 2024.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Samuel Adamson's delicious script is full of layers, so many that I don't doubt different audience members will take different things away from the performances.

Adamson uses Isben's classic A Doll's House as a core and tips his hat to the power of theatre. In each of the four time-frames depicted in *Wife*, our characters have just witnessed a performance of Isben's play and each have been affected either positively or negatively as a result.

Central to *Wife* is the character of 'Daisy' in our first chapter set in 1959. The decisions Daisy makes here affect the lives of the following three generations right up to our final chapter set in 2042.

Wife is a moving piece of writing that depicts the struggles of queer people during that time and what society forced many to become. This alone was enough to draw me to the play. We are all, in some way, shaped by who has come before us and the struggles they had to endure. We should never lose sight of that and I'm so pleased that we have a play that reminds us to reflect and respect.

The Cast and Creative team on this project are exceptional, all have given everything they have to make this production special. I am humbled to have been able to share this experience with every single one of them. Enjoy the show, pay attention, be in the moment whether that moment is 1959, 1988, 2019 or 2042.
