### DIRECTOR'S NOTE

I wrote this play in the weeks after being diagnosed with bipolar disorder. I'd spent a long time struggling with my mental health and after finally receiving my diagnosis and facing life with an answer I did a lot of introspection and looked into how bipolar was depicted and understood. It was pretty upsetting to see how my disease was being represented. That's what led to me writing *Fighting*.

This play is raw and by far the most personal I've ever written. I had to write it that way in order to achieve what I wanted. I wanted the audience to understand that we're not crazy. The difficulties are deeply rooted in psychology and thought patterns which attach themselves to physical symptoms and states. But I didn't want to write trauma porn. This play needed comedy throughout because if you don't laugh then you cry. Ultimately, I want an audience to do bóth those things and in the process be able to empathize a little because things that most people experience, sadness, anxiety, fear, are in bipolar, just to a much more intense level.

### XAVIER COY PLAYWRIGHT / DIRECTOR

Xavier is an award-winning writer, director, actor and producer based in Sydney. For New Theatre: actor, *The Removalists, Harvest*.

For theatre, Xavier has written Smokin' Joe, Distorted, Are You Listening Now?, Caught Out and Not Even God Can Save Us. He has also been part of the KXT Teethcutting program and the writer's festival at KXT. For screen, he wrote on Channel 10's Five Bedrooms, his short film Fighting

and his upcoming feature film *Unremarkable*, as well as being part of writing rooms with TV production companies across Sydney.

He currently has many projects in development including a musical about a battle of morning TV between Karl Stefanovic and Grant Denyer.

Xavier started directing plays over a decade ago. His most recent productions were his satire Not Even God Can Save Us which is in development for a film adaptation with his company, Caught Out which won the Sydney Fringe Award for best new play, his short film adaptation of the play Fighting which premiered at Sydney Film Festival and Unremarkable, produced by his company Blazing Battle Productions.

### **ROBIN LEGAL** LIGHTING DESIGNER

Robin is a French lighting technician and designer with experience in live performance and events. He trained in audiovisual techniques at GRIM EDIF in Lyon, France, and worked as a stage manager for Tech&Live, Eurosono Group (@eurosonogroupe on Instagram) for three years while completing his apprenticeship.

Robin has worked on a variety of productions, from theatre to architectural lighting projects and sports events, and has also worked on festivals, including Garma Festival\_and Darwin Festival in Australia, as well as Rhythm and Alps in New Zealand.

He is currently based in Sydney and continues to expand his career in Australia's theatre and event industries.

### HANSEN COSTUME DESIGNERS

Hansen is a collaboration dating back to 2011. The duo cut their teeth in underground theatre, designing costumes and sets for multiple productions, and have kept working together ever since even though their paths have taken them in very different directions. Collectively. they have designed costumes and sets for much of Xavier Coy's stage work, including productions of After Dinner, Moody Woods, Not Even God Can Save Us and Caught Out.

One part of the duo has remained working in Australia whilst the other has spent much time abroad. The Australian-based member has worked eclectically, contributing designs to a homewares line, a cocktail bar and designed a series of high-end dog harnesses, in addition to a variety of screen work.

The other worked extensively throughout Europe where they completed a residency with Romanian theatre maker Dáciana Cazacu before interning for Mongolian performance artist Baatar Batbayar.




### MEHRAN MORTEZAEI SOUND DESIGNER

Originally from Canberra, Sophie is now a Sydney-based actor, singer, dancer and choreographer. She completed a Diploma of Musical Theatre at NIDA before graduating from Actors Centre Australia with a Bachelor's Degree of Performing Arts (Stage and Screen). For New Theatre: Ink.
