#### **TAYLOR MAC PLAYWRIGHT**

The New York Times has written of Mac, "Fabulousness can come in many forms, and Taylor Mac seems intent on assuming every one of them." He is multi-talented - an actor, playwright, performance artist, director, producer, singer-songwriter. His work has been described as a fight against conformity and categorization.

Named "one of the most exciting theatre artists of our time" by Time Out NY, Tony Mac is the author of 17 full-length plays and performance pieces including A 24-Decade History of Popular Music (finalist for Pulitzer Prize for Drama), Hir (placed on the top ten theatre of 2015 lists of The New York Times, New York Magazine and Time Out NY; The Lily's Revenge (Obie Award); The Walk Across America for Mother Earth and Gary, A Sequel to Titus Andronicus. Mac is the recipient of multiple awards for his writing and acting, including the Ibsen Prize, the Kennedy Prize, Doris Duke Performing Artist Award, a Guggenheim Award, Award, the Helen Merrill Playwriting Award, MacArthur Genius Award and two Obies as well as Tony nominations. His work has been performed around the world from Broadway to the Lincoln Centre, the Barbican in London to Sydney Opera House.

Below are some edited extracts of Taylor Mac talking about Hir:-

"The catalyst for it (writing Hir) was certainly about growing up in Stockton, California, and in a place that I couldn't wait to get out of, couldn't wait to escape. Stockton is statistically one of the worst places to live in America and always has been in my lifetime, so that was the catalyst for the play, what responsibility do we have to something that has been abusive to us.

The plot of the play is prodigal son comes home from the war and everything that he knew of home to be is now different. His sister is no longer his sister but his transgender / genderqueer sibling. And so everything is different and the house is a total disaster. The father made everything be orderly and now nothing is orderly. They've decided to basically deconstruct their home. And then this transgender character, Max, is kind of stuck in the middle a little bit. In a lot of ways it's my way of saying, what if America (we always think of the prodigal son as the metaphor for America), what if the metaphor for America was the transgender kid instead? What does that do to our understanding of the United States?

So you're relating, or not relating, to the trans character in the way you relate to the current circumstances of America. It's not a play about gender. I started this play 17 years ago. I think people are able to hear the play now because our political situation is more dire."

Taylor Mac has chosen 'judy' as his gender pronoun ( with a capital J only at the beginning of a sentence) but happily responds to 'he'.

Patrick (he/him) is a freelance theatre artist and arts administrator. Born on Gundungurra Land, living and working on Gadigal Land, he has a passion for queer, political, devised, musical and documentary theatre, and works for Arts on Tour as Program Manager, Touring.

A graduate of AIM Dramatic Arts and the Sydney Conservatorium of Music, Patrick has performed, directed, production, company and stage managed, sound designed, composed and dramaturged for a number of different companies. These include PYT Fairfield, Force Majeure, Performance

Space, Sydney Opera House, ATYP, Contemporary Asian Australian Performance, The Last Great Hunt, Virginia Plain, Little Triangle, Red Line Productions, Arrive. Devise. Repeat., and New Theatre. He also makes and produces his own work and has conducted various teaching and mentoring engagements. Patrick was also a Play Assessor for New Theatre for eight years.

In May 2021 they completed a Bachelor of Performance (Dramatic Arts) at the Australian Institute of Music – Dramatic Arts (AIMDA). Between 2021-2023 they were a proud member of the PYT Fairfield Ensemble and Company, where they performed multiple acting, writing, producing and stage management roles. Olivia is currently a part of the 2024/2025 Page to Stage program with National

Theatre of Parramatta (NToP) and the National Institute of Dramatic Art (NIDA). Olivia also teaches Drama regularly across Intensive English Centres throughout Sydney.

## **DIEGO RETAMALES FIGHT CHOREOGRAPHER**

Diego (he/him) is a Chilean-Australian actor and fight choreographer based in Sydney. Diego graduated with a B. Performance from Theatre Nepean's final graduating year in 2008.
