AUTHOR'S NOTE by Moisés Kaufman

The Laramie Project was written through a unique collaboration by Tectonic Theater Project. During the year-and-a-half development of the play, members of the company and I traveled to Laramie six times to conduct interviews with people of the town. We transcribed and edited the interviews, then conducted several workshops in which members of the company presented material and acted as dramaturgs in the creation of the play.

As the volume of material grew with each additional trip to Laramie, a small writers' group from within the company began to work closely with me to further organize and edit the material, conduct additional research in Laramie, and collaborate on the writing of the play. This group was led by Leigh Fondakowksi as Head Writer, with Stephen Belber and Greg Pierotti as Associate Writers.

As we got closer to the play's first production in Denver, the actors, including Stephen Belber and Greg Pierotti, turned their focus to performance, while Leigh Fondakowski continued to work with me on drafts of the play, as did Stephen Wangh who by then had joined us as Associate Writer and "bench coach".



MOISÉS KAUFMAN, PLAYWRIGHT

Moises Kaufman (b. Caracus Venezuela 1963) is a playwright, theatre director and film-maker. In 2005 he described himself in an interview by saying, "I am Venezuelan, I am Jewish, I am gay, I live in New York. I am the sum of all my cultures. I couldn't write anything that didn't incorporate all that I am."

He was born and raised in Venezuela and in 1987 he moved to New York. In 1991 he was the co-founder (with his partner Jeffrey La Hoste) of Tectonic Theater Project, a company dedicated to examining the structure and language of theatre, as well as

addressing contemporary social issues.

Kaufman's writing debut, *Gross Indecency: The Three Trials of Oscar Wilde* (1997, produced by New Theatre in 2001) illustrated his concerns as a writer-director. He was especially interested in what he termed "watershed historical moments," events that reveal the foundations of society's beliefs.

The Laramie Project was based on extensive interviews which he and members of the Tectonic Theater Company conducted with residents and commentators in and around Wyoming in the aftermath of the murder of gay student Matthew Shepard.

He made his Broadway directing debut in the 2004 production of *I Am My Own Wife* by Doug Wright, for which he received a Tony Award nomination for Best Direction of a Play. He has been nominated and won many prestigious awards for both his playwriting and directing.

In 2016 Kaufman was awarded the National Medal of Arts and Humanities by U.S. president Barack Obama.

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

It is a little over 25 years since The Laramie Project premiered in Denver, Colorado. In May 2000 it was produced Off-Broadway in New York City. Soon after, the members of the Tectonic Theater Project took the play to Laramie, Wyoming. Over the ensuing years professional, community and university productions have been mounted around the world. It is estimated that in 20 countries (and 13 languages) over 10 million people have attended a production of this extraordinary theatre piece.

As the essence of Verbatim Theatre is to raise consciousness about an event by presenting real-life scenarios using the actual words of the characters involved, I for one wish I had been at that performance in Laramie. Rightly, the play has been instrumental in the healing process for that small rural town, however that incident in October 1998 still haunts its denizens. Astonishingly the US state of Wyoming to this day resists adopting into law a statute for criminal hate crime.

We as a company are proud to present this play to you tonight. As the director I wanted to present the story according to what was known at the time of its writing. I invite you to discover more about the events. Apart from the myriad of information online, the companion piece Ten Years Later is intriguing. The Matthew Shepard Foundation is a great resource. Stephen Jimenez's 2013 publication *The Book of Matt* should be read with caution as much of its content has been repudiated.

The relevance of The Laramie Project still stands. I long for the day when the negative attitudes in this play cease and the play takes on a different guise. Until certain politicians who "celebrate" and revel in peddling hate are gone from this world the power of this work will do what theatre does best - inform and create change. As Maya Angelou so aptly penned "when we know better, we do better".

Mark occasionally assists actors with audition preparation and accent coaching. In earlier years, he acted in over 20 productions in Sydney and London.




DR DAVID MARSHALL-MARTIN SET DESIGNER


BORA CELEBI STAGE MANAGER/UNDERSTUDY


